February 1917, until wounded on 6th. July, 1917. By co-ordinating the work of Intelligence Officers and supervision of Units forming up preparatory to the attack on HINDENBURG LINE near BULLECOURT on 11th. April, 1917, the Brigade jumped off with every chance of success. In the withdrawal the same afternoon he was a great assistance to Battalion Commanders. Again at MESSINES on night 9/10th. June, 1917, and night 10/11th. June, 1917, he made personal reconnaissances in the Front Line and brought back first hand information of an obscure situation.	Brigadier-General C.H.
