He detected and controlled 300 yards of captured position and held this line until relieved by 13<sup>th</sup> Battalion on night 10<sup>th</sup> &amp; 11<sup>th</sup> August 1916. The careful handling of his men particularly when having to evacuate trench 53-74-95 (R 34 A Drome de Manque map) under enemy artillery fire and without a casualty prior to bombardment of our heavy artillery on 31-65-96 (R 34 A Drome de Manque map) showed him to be a very capable leader of men. From night 5<sup>th</sup> &amp; 6<sup>th</sup> August until night 10<sup>th</sup> August this officer was continuously in front line trenches and throughout showed considerable devotion to duty.</p>	<p>21-1st Lt.
